Draft Proposed 2021-2022 Oshawa Executive Airport Action Plan

- The 2015-2019 Airport Business Plan was prepared to guide actions and the decision making process at the Oshawa Executive Airport.
- As its timeframe has ended, the 2015-2019 Airport Business Plan needs to be updated. The update process was initiated but due to the COVID-19 pandemic, public and stakeholder engagement could not be advanced within the intended time frame.
- Owing to the timing of the current term of Council, it is appropriate to develop an Action Plan with a list of action items for the City and the Airport Manager to advance over the remainder of the current term of Council.

Action Items

- The draft proposed Action Plan contains 14 Action Items related to the Oshawa Executive Airport for the City to advance prior to the next term of Council.
- Action 1: Continue to advance an appropriate balance between the Airport and the residential communities.



Action Items

- Action 2: Continue to defend the City's interests in legal proceedings involving Canadian Flight Academy Ltd.
- Action 3: Market the Airport as an Executive Airport.
- Action 4: Advance opportunities to restrict flight training schools.
 - Action 4A: Re-affirm for Transport Canada that the City of Oshawa is formally opposed to the establishment of new flight training schools at the Airport.



Action Items

- Action 4B: Investigate an amendment to Zoning By-law 60-94 to limit the number of flight training schools at the Airport.
- Action 5: Complete Phase 2 of the Air Quality and Noise Study.
- Action 6: Continue to investigate the process to establish new noise abatement procedures and restrictions.
- Action 7: Explore new technologies and the use of unleaded fuels.



Action Items

- Action 8: Continue to advocate with Transport Canada for increased enforcement of safety.
- Action 9: Continue to advocate with Federal and local Elected Officials.
- Action 10: Initiate review of fees.
- Action 11: Update the 25 Year Capital Forecast through the Annual Budget.

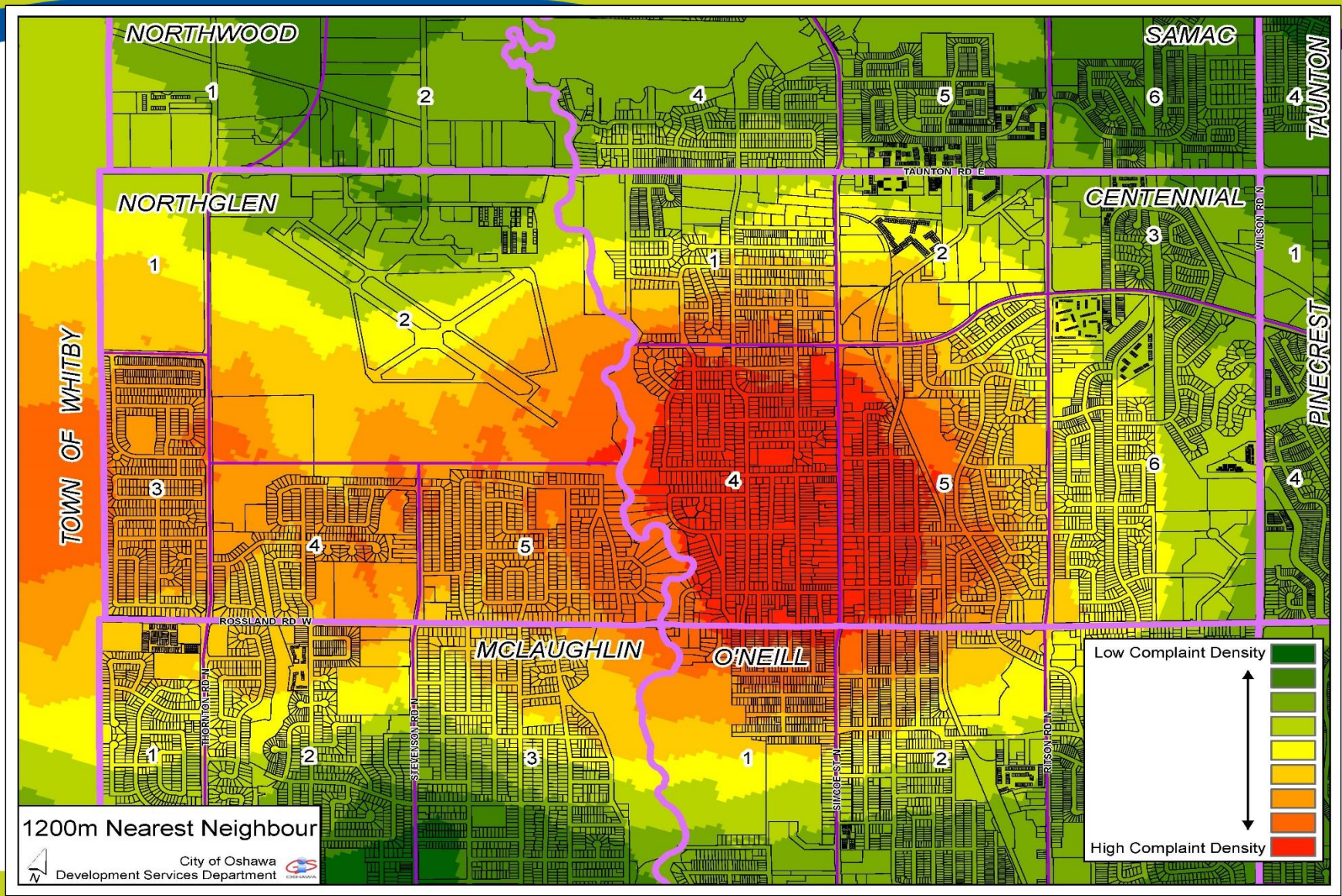

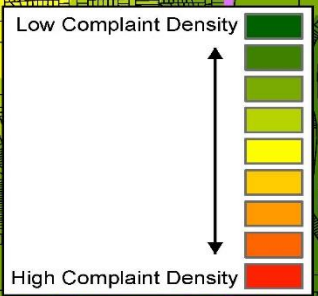
- Action 12: Continue to advance recommendations of the independent K.P.M.G. Airport Audit.
