

The City of Oshawa has implemented the following COVID-19 measures in order to maintain a safe environment for public and staff with regards to use of municipal facilities including indoor track facilities. Please review and be familiar with the following protocols:

Proof of Vaccination and Screening

- All patrons 12 years and older are required to provide proof of identification and of being fully vaccinated against COVID-19. This includes spectators, athletes, coaches, officials, and volunteers.
 - Children 11 years old and younger are not required to show proof of vaccination, proof of identification showing name and age **may be required**.
- All patrons are required to show proof of the successful completion of the City of Oshawa online COVID-19 screening at www.oshawa.ca/screening prior to entering the facility.
- It is the responsibility of the permit holder to ensure all participants have completed the online screening prior to entering the facility.

Entry and Exit Requirements

- City of Oshawa staff will open the door to allow the group to enter the facility and verify screening.
- All participants of a rental are to enter the facility at the same time; no earlier than 5 minutes prior to the start of the rental.
- Participants who arrive after a group has entered the facility are required to contact permit holder or organization lead for screening and to ensure the rental is below capacity restrictions, prior to entering the facility.
- Upon entry, all facility users are required to wear a mask or face covering that effectively covers their nose and mouth. Participants may only remove their face covering when they begin engaging in active track use. Masks/face coverings must be worn during extended breaks and while walking through common areas throughout the facility.
- Participants are expected to arrive ready in their track attire with exception of indoor running shoes. Changerooms are now available for use, changing in hallways and other spaces is not permitted.
- Mats have been removed from the warm up area at the south end of the Dome. Athletes are welcome to bring their own mat if they wish.
- No spectators are permitted in the Dome at the Civic Recreation Complex.
- No outside food or drink.
- No in/out privileges.
- Loitering and clustering of people in areas such as the lobby, hallways, parking lots and perimeter of the Dome is not permitted.
- Participants are to exit through the airlock door and out through the emergency exit (adjacent to the Dome changerooms) to the parking lot; no more than 5 minutes after their program time.

Indoor Track Protocol

Indoor Track Facility Information

- It is the responsibility of the permit holder or organization lead to ensure that the track does not exceed the maximum capacity of 45 people (15 people per lane). This includes athletes and coaching staff.
- The following facility capacity limits and physical distancing requirements are adhered to at all times inside the facility:
 - Spectators are not allowed.
 - Warmups and stretching must occur within the permitted time on the rental agreement.
 - Physical distancing of at least 2 metres (6 feet) should be maintained.
 - Lane 1 remains closed and may not be utilized **at any time**.
- Benches are open. Physical distancing is required on the benches.
- Participants should bring a pre-filled water bottle; no sharing of water bottles.
- Participants are not to be accessing other areas of the facility with the exception of washroom access. Should you require access to reception services or other areas of the facility, you must report to the screening checkpoint at the main entrance.
- Signage and floor markings in the facility must be adhered to.

Cleaning and Disinfecting Requirements

- City of Oshawa staff is responsible for and will be cleaning, sanitizing and disinfecting touch points.
- Available washroom facilities will be cleaned as per [Public Health Guidelines](#).

Respect Check Policy

- Individuals, organizations and user groups making use of city facilities are responsible for applying the council-approved Respect Check Policy to their programs, to champion ethical conduct, foster healthy and active lifestyles and create a safe and welcoming environment. The policy enforces a set of expectations to address inappropriate behaviours, violence and vandalism that negatively affects the experience of individuals or creates unsafe conditions in any City facility, in association with any service, program or event provided by or associated with the City of Oshawa.
